Sharing God's love through Christmas Cheer



Our Presiding Bishop Michael Curry has called all members of the Episcopal Church to reexamine how we are living out the gospel in our communities. He calls us to remember that we are the Episcopal Branch of the Jesus Movement and are called to share God's love with our community.

We are called to not only preach but to live out God's love in the world. Finding new ways to share this love with those who cross our paths. The Presiding Bishop is focusing on teaching Episcopalians how to be evangelists. The word evangelist has many connotations in our minds, including some not so pleasant ones. However, it is drawn from the Greek word to tell the good news. It does not necessarily mean standing on the corner and preaching, but it is sharing the love we have in Jesus with those around us.

I want to invite you to share some love with St. Clement's neighbors this Advent. On Thursdays, December 14 and 21 we are going to have a Parish of St. Clement booth at the Farmer's Market. Our Episcopalian friendly evangelism will involve handing out candy canes to those who come to the market and wishing them a Merry Christmas. All ages are welcome and encouraged to be involved (chairs will be available for those who prefer sitting). 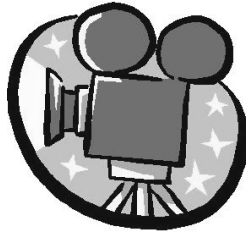

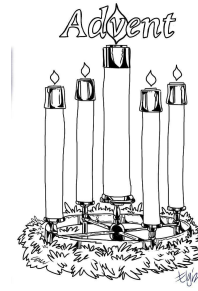

Advent IV and Christmas Eve

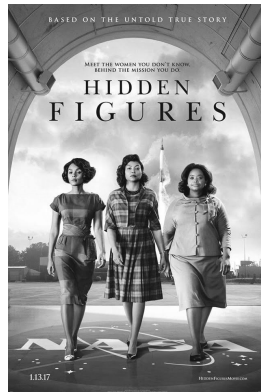

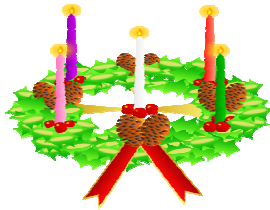
A Celebration of New Ministry January 13, 2018 - 4 pm

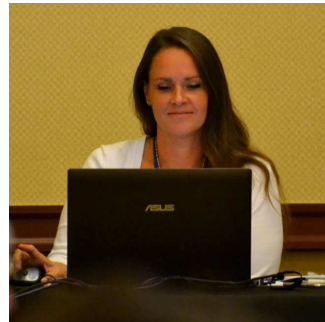

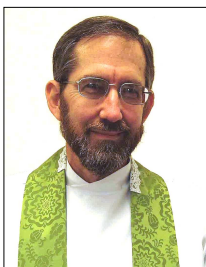


Camp Mokule'ia Volunteer Day

"Mahalo Cecilia and St. Clement's for all you do for our families in need. We appreciate you all helping make this week brighter for our families at First Christian."

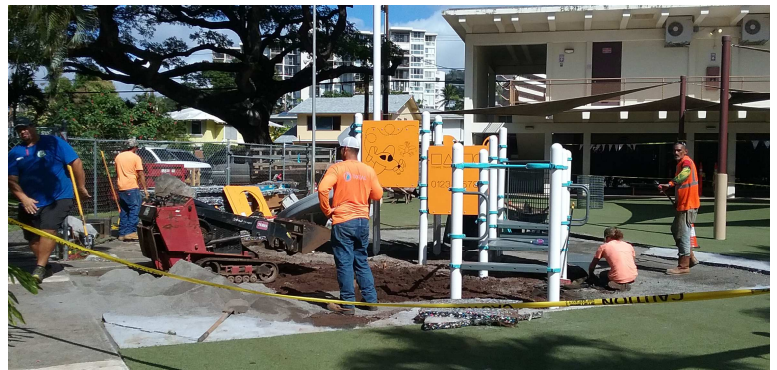
Cecilia Fordham added her own message to her helpers **Kiki Fordham** and **Pam Fern**:

A New Pearl Harbor Memorial

Because of issues around the loss of the lease on the land, St. George's Episcopal Church, Pearl Harbor, closed over two years ago. That Church was originally built as a memorial to those who died on December 7, 1941. A new Memorial to those who died on December 7, 1941 has been installed in the Cathedral of St. Andrew (see photo). The artist has included the cross that was embedded in the altar at St. George's Church. The metal of the cross originally came from USS Arizona. This Memorial will also be dedicated in thanksgiving to all those who worshipped at St. George's Church through the years. The new Diocesan Pearl Harbor Memorial will be dedicated on Sunday, December 10, 2017, 5:30 PM, during Evensong at the Cathedral of St. Andrew,

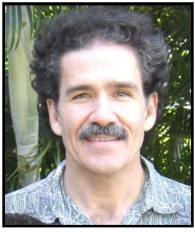

A View from the Pew

“Because He inclines His ear down to me, I will call upon Him as long as I live.”

~~ David / Psalm 116:2



In a recent conversation, and coincidentally in an article I just read, people expressed outrage about how other people, who had been in recent natural and human-made disasters, could possibly pray for their personal earthly salvation from these disasters.

Examples included a homeowner in Facebook expressing her thanks to God that her prayers had been answered when her home had been spared from wildfires in California. Another was a store owner in Texas who told the AP how thankful he was that God heard his prayers and saved his family business from hurricane winds and flooding. Then there was a young woman on CNN who said she prayed all night to God to keep her missing young man safe after a massacre in Nevada, and how her prayers were affirmed the next morning in a text from him saying he had been wounded, and that he was in the hospital, but he was going to be okay.

So, why the outrage? The logic is, how could someone pray for their own personal earthly salvation and not everyone else's too? How could someone give thanks for their prayers being answered when, presumably, so many other's prayers went unanswered? Is God not satisfied with the quality or quantity of the prayers of others? Do some people's prayers have priority in God's view over the prayers of others? Is one person's home, business, or loved one more important to God than someone else's? What about the people who did not pray? Are they being ignored or punished by God for their oversight or lack of faith? When people pray and give thanks to God for their personal salvation, are they not in effect expressing gratitude that the horrible happened to someone else and not to them? Given this logic, you can understand why people might say something like the old axiom, *“I believe we should pray for strength and guidance alone.”* In other words, prayers to God for our personal earthly salvation from whatever hardship or affliction is self-centered at best, insensitive and uncaring at least, and damning at worst.

The problem with this logic, however logical, is that throughout the Original and New Testaments, our Holy Scriptures, the moral and ethical fibers of our faith in God and our ministries serving one another, people pray to God for their personal earthly salvation from hardship and affliction time and time again and, in one fashion or another, and frequently in ways both unexpected nor hoped for, God always answered their prayers. In Genesis, after Cain murders his brother Abel, he is banished by God, but

after Cain prays to God pleading that he cannot bear this punishment, God relents and protects him with the “Mark of Cain,” thus shielding him from harm in exile for the rest of his life. Then there is the mysterious Jabez in Chronicles, about whom we only know that he was “more honorable than his brethren” and that his mother “bore him with pain,” but that in response to his prayers God increased the borders of his domain, guided him through every hardship, protected him from evil, and delivered him from grief. What about the ten lepers in Luke, coming up to Jesus and praying to be cured, being cured, and then giving thanks? Let's not forget Jesus, the Messiah, in whom God was fully revealed in our humanity. Shortly after his Last Supper in John, he says to his disciples, “Ask and you will receive, so that your joy may be complete.” Then in Matthew, shortly before being arrested and crucified, Jesus prays to God in Gethsemane saying, “My Father, if it is possible, may this cup be taken from me. Yet not as I will, but as You will.”

Excuse me? What kind of “parent” would allow their “child” to be crucified if it was in their power in any way to prevent it? Worse yet, what kind of “parent” would “will” such a thing on their child? Come on now! How come one hopeful prayer was not “received” yet the other despairing prayer was? Gee, thanks God, such an incredible “joy.” I feel so “complete” now . . .

In trying to limit the scope of our prayers, no matter how well intended, we are missing the point of prayer altogether and, in the process, we are trying to create a “God in our own image.” We want God to be just like us and do what we would do “here on Earth,” but not “as it is in Heaven.” We want logic and consistency and, as a result, we want God to be logical and consistent, as well. The problem is these are human notions of logic and consistency. In fact, logic and consistency are entirely human notions. They are not infinite, eternal, or divine. Logic and consistency are our images, in our very limited humanity, not the Image of God in God's unlimited spirituality.

So, what is my point? My point is, regardless of what we ask, like Jesus, we must in our prayers humbly conform and dedicate them to God's Will. We must have faith that, no matter how much our prayers appear to be answered or how unanswered they may appear, God's response, no matter how distant or near, how corporeal or unclear, is the fulfilment of God's Kingdom and our inclusion in it.
