From Canon Kate



This past month we celebrated Epiphany and the coming of the *magi* to the infant Jesus to honor him with gifts. What is represented by the wise men approaching Jesus is humanity's response to the God who comes to us. God comes to us at Christmas and becomes incarnate. We come to God during Epiphany. The *magi* symbolize to us the coming of the gentiles and all of humanity to the presence

of God now made manifest in Jesus and now present to us. God comes to us at Christmas. In Epiphany, we come to God in response to God having already come to us.

Christmas is a time when we celebrate the incarnation. A parishioner just this week asked me what the word, incarnation, actually meant. Please allow me a bit of description about the etymology of the word, **incarnation**.

Carne, from the Latin, means flesh. Whether we realize it or not, we know the Latin root of the term carne in our English word: incarnation. The Latin word, carne, shows up in English in words like: carnivore (flesh or meat eater), carnal (of the flesh), carnival (carne+vale, two Latin words which mean "flesh," and "farewell"). So, the carnival which takes place the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday and which is so exuberantly celebrated in New Orleans (also known as Mardi Gras from the French meaning Fat Tuesday), and in the countries of Trinidad and Tobago and Brazil has its roots in saying farewell to all of the fleshly desires on Fat Tuesday in order to prepare for the coming of Lent on Ash Wednesday. Lent is a time when things of the flesh and other desires are put aside and said "goodbye to" in a period designated for fasting, sacrifice, and almsgiving in preparation for Easter.

The incarnation refers to the en-fleshment of God. God becomes flesh. God becomes human in Jesus. This is what we just celebrate at Christmas. We celebrate the fact that God

loved us so much that God sent God's only son to become human and one of us in the very same flesh that we share. In this way, the creator has joined with the creation and lifts the creation up and into the creator for all time. We are joined to God forever through the incarnation of Jesus in human flesh.

As I write this article explaining the incarnation and the celebration we just had with Jesus coming to us in the flesh at Christmas, I also realize that this is the article for the February newsletter and that Lent will soon be upon us almost as soon as you read this. Christmas is a time when we celebrate the fact that God chose to come to us. Epiphany is a season in which we acknowledge that it is up to us to respond to God's invitation to move the journey of our lives in a direction toward God. Lent is a time when we are challenged to refocus our lives once more on the gift of grace freely given to us with no merit or action on our part.

I hope you had a blessed Christmas, a challenging Epiphany and I also pray that we will all have a holy Lent.










We are very much looking forward to posting the profile and to then beginning the process of interviewing potential candidates.


We thank you for your support and ask for your continuing prayers as we continue on this important journey.

A View from the Pew

"Truly I tell you, whatever you bind on Earth will be bound in Heaven, and whatever you loose on Earth will be loosed in Heaven"

Jesus / Matthew 18:18



Epiphany, the third Liturgical Season of the Church, is the season during which we recall how God was and is revealed in Jesus. As a result, inescapably, it is also when we recall how God was and is revealed in the rest of God's Creation, including Humanity, meaning you and me.

In the Bible, Humanity, "ben Adam" in ancient Hebrew, meant the "Son of Man." Additionally, Humanity was and is created in the Image of God. So how can Humanity be the Son of Man if also we were and are created by God? That is, if we are the "Son of Man," implying the children of Humanity, and if we were created by God, implying God is our Parent or "The Father" as described in the Bible, then doesn't this logically, granted cyclically, mean that God and Humanity are one in the same? God created Humanity ~ Humanity created God ~ God created God?

On the surface, the answer is easy: "No." God first created "Adam," and then the rest of us, meaning Humanity, are descended from him. As a result, allegorically like DNA, the God in Adam has been passed down from generation to generation into all of Humanity right down to the present day, and will continue to be passed down as long as there is Humanity.

However, here is the difficult part, in Matthew 18:20, Jesus tell us: "For where two or three are gathered in My name, I am there among them."

What is so hard about this? Superficially, it is easy to explain that, in his infinite mercy and love, Jesus graciously appears when at least two or three of us faithful believers come together to worship with and/or minister to one another in his name. And, quite frankly, given how infinitely merciful, loving, and gracious Jesus is, it is a good explanation.

Yet, it is not that easy, as if anything Jesus ever said or did was. It isn't even the point. If you put in context only Verse 20 in Chapter 18 of Matthew with just the verse before it, not to mention all of the verses before that and thereafter in Chapter 18, this is not a discussion or lesson about belief, faith, mercy, love, or grace. It is about Humanity's interdependent relationship with God and one another, and the interdependent relationship of our earthly experience with our experience in heaven. Jesus is telling us that our relationship with God and one another, and that our Human experience now and our heavenly experience to come, are all mutually inclusive, meaning they are intimately related to the point of being inseparable. In other words, they do not and cannot occur independent of one another.

As a result, taken in the context, Verse 20 of Chapter 18 of Matthew is not saying that God as revealed in Jesus is going to appear any time or every time two or three of us come together in his name. In fact, if we read the verse carefully, it never said or meant that at all. Instead of appearing to us, the verse says there among us. In other words, Jesus does not somehow arrive when we gather together in his name. On the contrary, Jesus is and was already there, but waits to be revealed as such when we commune with one another in his name. We can make all of the ado about the Presence of the Body and Blood of Christ in the Holy Eucharist as we want to, and to be sure, there is much ado to be made, but if we, meaning you and me, are not there in his name, then neither is Jesus and, no matter what kind of or how many ecclesiastical blessings are made, his body and blood will not be there either.

We are the Communion. We are the individual members that make up the complete Body of Christ. As God is fully revealed in Christ, we the individual, incomplete and imperfect Images of God collectively and perfectly complete God's Image. Individually, we are isolated, alone, incomplete and unfulfilled, and nowhere near realizing our full human and spiritual potential. We can deny God, we can refuse God, we can flee God, but we cannot escape God any more than we can escape our own Humanity, not to mention one another. We, too, in all of our frailties and deficiencies, are God revealed.

"Again, truly I tell you, if two of you agree on earth about anything you ask, it will be done for you by my Father in Heaven."
