Epiphany. Illumination. Manifestation. Revelation. Don't get me wrong, I understand we Episcopalians get a little edgy with that last synonym. Probably because it reminds us of that "uncomfortable" as it is difficult to understand final book of the New Testament, Revelations. In fact, we are probably as uncomfortable with Revelations as our more conservative and fundamental Christian brothers and sisters are comfortable with it, they tending to accept it as literally as we tend to reject it. Even so, here is my Epiphany this season: Revelations are not something or someone revealed, but instead being revealed, in the process of being revealed, to you and me.

It is much like the concept of "kensho" in Zen Buddhism. In Zen, it means a "glimpse," "glimmer," or an initial "insight." It refers to the process in meditation, whether still or in motion, of gradually becoming aware of our stream of thoughts, thereby allowing them to be realized, meaning understood for what they are, notably our very nature, whereby they subsequently pass on without further interference, whether with our own internal illusions or the illusions beyond ourselves. Yet, "kensho" is not to be confused with "satori," meaning "enlightenment." While the "room" may be "illuminated" to a certain degree by one or more "kensho" experiences, meaning "insights," it has not been entirely revealed. In other words, and this is why Zen masters continue to meditate as an expression of their daily lives, "kensho" is the infinite stones we step on and discern along the "way," whereas "satori," meaning "enlightenment," is to resolutely travel the unending "path" over the course of our lives.

In other words, or as my mother used to scold, "Continue Scott, please make a perfectly good short story long," my Epiphany this season, in its Christian context, is that God, in so many different if not infinite ways, has chosen to reveal God's Self to us in an unending stream of "glimpses" if you will, "revelations" more precisely. In particular, and infinitely so, that God chose to reveal God's Self in our very own and very finite humanity in the personage of Jesus. That what appears to be a contradiction is actually in accord, meaning that God was, is, and continues to be infinitely revealed in our finite humanity through the Body of Christ, you and me. That this contradiction and accord is in reality a "glimpse" into what God had, has, and will have in Mind for us in

relation to our individual and collective deliverance through this incredible as it is unpredictable and often tragic existential Human Experience, not to mention our salvation and eternal lives in the transcendental Heavenly Experience to come.

In choosing a very young, naïve, betrothed yet unmarried, and underprivileged woman named Mary to be Jesus' mother; in choosing an older, widowed, rustic, and marginally employed stonemason and carpenter named Joseph to be Jesus' father; in choosing a sleepy little village named Bethlehem as Jesus' place of birth, where likewise ten centuries before a boy named David from a sheep herding family was born who would become King of a united Israel; and, in choosing a "backwater" like Nazareth in which Jesus was raised and formed as opposed to the prominent fishing ports along the Sea of Galilee, God was and is likewise choosing you and me. God was and is being inclusive not exclusive. God was and is equitable instead of chauvinistic. God was and is merciful as opposed to uncompassionate. God was and is loving rather than aloof. God was and is here, experiencing our misery and joy, our despair and happiness, our poverty and abundance, and our isolation and fellowship.

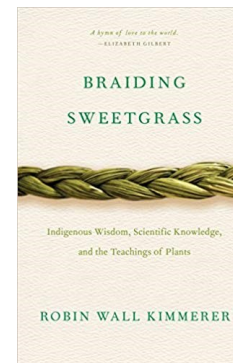

ENTRANCE: Stand at the entrance and be the gate keeper. Ask if they are there long term, short term or In/Out, Send the cars to the Runner or Driver to park in appropriate areas.

DRIVERS: If a car needs to be moved, the Drivers will move it. At times, Drivers will assist customers with parking. Assist each other as spotters. (Spotters will guide Drivers with parking or moving cars to ensure safe maneuvering, especially at Night)

Absolutely no cars are to leave the property!!!

RUNNERS: Collect the money & keys with receipt from the parking attendants & deliver them to the cashier at the key table. If needed and willing, assist as Driver or Spotter.

CASHIER: Collect Ziploc bag (with the money, key & receipt in it) from the runners. Give any change needed back to the runner.
