## School Snap Shots



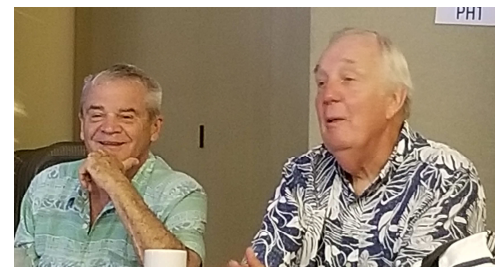

## A View from the Pew



It is the Season of Pentecost, when we celebrate the Apostles fanning out across the Middle East, North Africa, Asia Minor, Southern Europe, the Persian Gulf and even India at the dawn of Christianity, sharing the Good News, the Gospel of Jesus. Based originally in Jewish communities wherever the arteries of the Roman Empire led them, the Apostles

established the primordial churches of the Christian faith, ministering first to Jews who embraced Jesus as their Messiah, and soon thereafter to Gentiles converting from their pantheistic and polytheistic religions to monotheistic Christianity. It was a time of spiritual and religious upheaval and growth. So much so that, some 300 years later, Christianity became the dominant faith in the Roman Empire and the emperor, Constantine the Great, considered a god himself within the imperial cult, renounced his divinity and converted to Christianity, too.

Ironically, the Season of Pentecost is as significant as most of us are ignorant of it, meaning very much so. Pentecost and the season that follows is more than Christian history. It is a symbol of our faith. Its liturgical color ~ green ~ represents life, growth and abundance. The opposite is stagnation, meaning inactivity, scarcity and death. In other words, how can we as Christians be the embodiment of our faith, the Living Word, God's very Self revealed in The Law, The Prophets, and Jesus, if we are not a living religion, too? How can we moan, groan, and bemoan a shrinking church, how can we brainstorm, plan, and organize ways to revive it, if we have little to no idea let alone an understanding of the roots of our faith and why it became the most populous religion in the world? All of which, more than our collective ignorance of Pentecost, is why I am confounded by the efforts of many, lay and clergy alike, who by willful neglect or benign intent diminish Pentecost's meaning and thus its importance.

The word *Pentecost* comes from the Hellenist or Koine Greek word *Pentekosti*, meaning *50 Days*. Pentecost was first a Jewish Holy Day long before it became a Christian one. However, in addition to celebrating two different yet very related events in Jewish and Christian Holy Scripture, because Christians use the solar Gregorian Calendar and Jews use the lunar Hebrew Calendar, the two religions usually celebrate Pentecost at different times. Nonetheless, Jewish Pentecost celebrates Moses, *10 days* after leading Israel out of Egypt into the Sinai wilderness, stopping everyone at Mt. Sinai, ascending Mt. Sinai, spending *40 days* with God revealed as a Burning Bush, and where God prepared Moses to lead Israel back to Canaan. After a total of *50 days* from the original Passover, hence Pentecost, Moses descended Mt. Sinai and shared with Israel God revealed in God's Word, the foundation of Jewish Law and the inspiration of the Prophets, the Ten Commandments. Christian Pentecost, on the other hand, celebrates Jesus' final preparations of his Disciples to become his Apostles over the *40 days* immediately following his Resurrection. After *40 days*, Jesus Ascended into Heaven, but not before telling his Disciples to remain

in Jerusalem for Jewish Pentecost, which occurred *10 days* later. After a total of *50 days* from the Resurrection or Christian Passover, hence Pentecost as well, in a vision of *Tongues of Fire* the Disciples were filled with God the Holy Spirit, became Jesus' Apostles, and who on their ecstatic *Tongues* revealed God's Word to Jerusalem in all of the languages spoken by Jews in the Mediterranean.

If you are a "progressive" Jew, you point out that yes, while all of the above about Passover, Moses, and the Ten Commandments is commendable, in actuality Jewish Pentecost ~ in Hebrew Shavu'ot ~ is really descended from an ancient Canaanite harvest festival which the later peoples of Israel over-laid with the Jewish Pentecost myth. If you are a "progressive" Christian, in addition to the above Shavu'ot pretext, with a touch of embarrassment you acknowledge the Tongues of Fire and ecstatic utterances of the Apostles are preposterous, and that the whole point of Christian Pentecost is to emphasize in an enhanced and mystic sort of way that the Spirit of God can work in all of us in a commendable sort of way.

We have missed the point. The Jewish celebration of Shavu'ot is not about an autumn harvest of bounty and abundance. It is about a spring famine harvest after all of the winter's stores have been completely exhausted. It is about a people starving for spiritual rescue, and a God who provides for them in their spiritual wilderness spiritual bread on the desert floor to gather in the mornings, spiritual water to collect from the stones in the afternoons, and spiritual flocks of quail in the grasslands to snare in the evenings. To quote the Lord's Prayer as literally translated from its original Greek, "Give us this day the bread which sustains us." In the same way, Christian Pentecost is not about miraculous visions and ecstatic utterances. It is about lighting up the spiritual lives of people who are spiritually dark and cold. It is about filling the spiritual voids in people who, by virtue of being the Images of God, are spiritual beings but whose lives have become so profoundly empty that they have nothing left to share. Pentecost, both Jewish and Christian, means spiritually feeding and filling those of us who are most in need, whose basic spiritual needs are not being met, who by Biblical definition are our Neighbors, and we theirs.

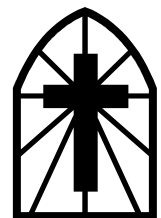
