### The Choirs of St. Clement By Kathleen Norris

Choral services were offered on major feast days at St. Clement's beginning on Easter, 1898. "The Hawaii Church Chronicle" of April, 1910, notes that several members who had sung in that early Easter service also sang in the most recent, when the choir was assisted by an obligato sung by Miss Kulumanu Ward.

In the early 1930's during the tenure of Rev. Edward Tanner Brown, a junior quartet was formed but soon expanded to a choir with alto, soprano, tenor, and bass voices. Over the years youth choirs have been led by Mrs. Kenneth McLeod and then Mrs. William Fraser. In 1960 voice teacher Eunice DeMello organized three choirs at St. Clement's: the Saint David's Choir, consisting of men and boys who sang once a month at the Saturday 6 PM Eucharist; a Preparatory choir for girls ages 6 to 14; and the adult choir. The latter traveled to England in 1992 to participate in the Malvern International Choir Festival, working with composer John Rutter. DeMello also founded the Players of St. Clement's that presented "The Fantastics," "Ahmal and the Night Visitors," and Dave Brubeck's "A Light in the Wilderness." The group also recorded Bach's Magnificat at St. Andrew's Cathedral. Choir directors since DeMello left have included Amy Healy, Mark Haworth Julia Golding, Karol Novisky, and currently, Beth Fincke. Walter Kau was our organist for nearly 50 years; after he retired, Deborah Zucher and River Kim have served. Our current organist is Mark Kennedy.

For many years the choir held a Green and Silver Tea, a fund raiser for which choir members prepared and served the food, and performed during the meal. The event has taken many forms, including an Oktoberfest, an ice cream parlor, and a formal tea. In the 2000's it was held at the church on Sunday mornings and funds raised have gone to choir retreats, refurbishing of choir robes, and community charities. The tea is the kind of activity that the pandemic curtailed, and it is hoped that it will be restored to enhance our parish life.

One note of interest: in 1957, when the vestry received a complaint that some women in the choir were not wearing stockings, the vestry quickly resolved that the wearing of stockings be made optional.

### St. Clement, A Partner with Hawaii's Food Bank

WHY? Jesus said, "I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me.... Truly I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these ..., you did it to me."

WHAT? Saint Clement's Food Distribution Ministry has been going strong for 26 years. Begun under the direction of Father Steven Bonsey, it has been aiding the hungry with at first a monthly but now weekly distribution of bags of canned foods and non-perishables.

As a partner agency with the state's Food Bank, the church obtains the food for free. Two or three times a month, volunteers Holo Stender and Beth Fincke travel to the warehouse in Mapunapuna where they load up Holo's truck with boxes of food items. There are rules, for example they are limited to ten cases of protein per visit. According to Beth, "It can be challenging to make sure we can schedule a time to pick up the food."

WHO? Last year, St. Clement helped to feed a total of 2,129 needy adults and 693 children, a significant increase in number over the year before. Most are retired seniors, often elderly women living on fixed incomes, and many are immigrants as well. They come from many parts of the island. Some are even from out of state.

WHEN? Ann Ogilvie is one of the volunteers who participates in the Wednesday morning food distribution which runs weekly from 10:00 AM to 12:00 PM. Our crew also includes Annette Kirkpatric, and Chris Hacskaylo. The Parish's Office Manager, Leesa Steadman, helps coordinate and train our frontline volunteers.



#### TYPHOON MAWAR SLAMS GUAM



As you know, <u>Typhoon Mawar</u> unleashed winds of over 145 miles an hour and torrential rain on the island of Guam. I have been in touch with the Reverend Irene Maliaman, a priest of the Diocese of Hawai'i who serves as the Archdeacon of the Episcopal Church in Micronesia, the Vicar of <u>The Episcopal Church of St. John the Divine</u>, and the only active Episcopal Priest currently residing full-time on Guam.

St. John's Church suffered blown out glass doors and some flooding, but it appears there is no major damage. Families were sheltering in the Church's office and in the Vicarage throughout the storm. I have not received a report yet on St. John's School.

Guam takes typhoons very seriously and typically hunker down in reinforced concrete structures. Initial early news reports from the government of Guam suggest only moderate damage such as flooding, fallen debris and downed power lines. I'm awaiting more details as the evaluation continues. Folk will need help with cleanup.

### Presiding Bishop Michael Curry Receiving Medical Monitoring and Treatment

[Episcopal News Service] The Episcopal Church's Office of Public Affairs released the following statement on May 30, with information about medical care Presiding Bishop Michael Curry is receiving for internal bleeding and an irregular heartbeat.

Over Memorial Day weekend, Episcopal Church Presiding Bishop Michael Curry was admitted to the hospital in Raleigh, North Carolina, where he underwent testing for internal bleeding and a heart condition. He has been discharged and will be monitored while working on a reduced schedule from home.

Curry's internal bleeding is under control, and additional test results are expected later this week. He has been receiving treatment for atrial fibrillation (AFib), which was detected in an annual physical. While in the hospital, Curry experienced two other episodes of irregular heartbeat, and he will wear a heart monitor to determine what further treatment is necessary.

Until he is cleared for air travel by his medical team, Curry will remain in Raleigh, resting and working from home on a reduced schedule. As more information becomes available regarding Curry's health and schedule, his staff will provide updates.

Please pray for a full and speedy recovery—and for Curry's medical team as they identify the best course of treatment.
