### LIVING IN LENT

It's finally here. Lent. It's hard to believe that the Epiphany season is already over. We now shift into that penitential season.

The Church offers us Lent as a time to reflect on our lives, to find aspects of them that need spring cleaning, and to put those back into order. The big three traditional practices the Church suggests to us during this season are prayer, fasting, and charity.

Peter Chrysologus, the fifth century Bishop of Ravenna and one of the Doctors of the Church wrote, "There are three things, my friends, by which faith stands firm, devotion remains constant, and virtue endures. They are prayer, fasting, and mercy. Prayer knocks at the door, fasting obtains, mercy receives. Prayer, mercy, and fasting: these three are one, and they give life to each other."

**Prayer** is the first thing we're asked to do. Perhaps that means that we're even more determined to attend church every Sunday or even to attend a mid-week service at St. Clement's or somewhere near home or work. But we shouldn't be praying only at Church. We can pray in the car while we're driving instead of listening to the radio, or we could maybe even say Morning Prayer out of the Prayer Book's Daily Office. Praying helps us think of God more often and to realign our priorities.

**Fasting** is the second big Lenten practice. Usually we think of fasting as abstinence from food. There are only two days the Episcopal Church specifically asks her members to fast: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Now the Prayer Book doesn't define fasting, and there are different ways to fast. If we're able, we could do an "absolute fast": refraining from solid food (and other unnecessary drinks: alcohol, coffee, soda, etc.) throughout

the day until we break our fast at sundown. Or, we could do a partial fast, only eating a single meal on those days, or eating just a couple of small meals. Or, we could simplify our diet that day: cutting out any snacks during the day, abstaining from meat during our meals, drink only water or juice. Of course, those who are sick or frail are never expected to fast.

There are other types of fasting in Lent. It is a common practice to "give up something" for Lent. Giving something up is a form of self-denial. We might give up watching TV or eating sweets or going out to movies. Every time we have a craving for what we gave up is a time to reflect on why we are participating in the fast and a reminder to think of God's presence in our lives. Often this becomes a good moment to say a prayer and helps us grow closer to God. In this way, fasting leads to devotional time.

Finally we come to **charity**. During Lent, we are especially mindful of those who are less fortunate, and we give money to the homeless agencies that help those in need. Charity also includes service, like donating our time to help out at a soup kitchen, our own Food Distribution Saturday, or other service work. Almsgiving keeps us from taking the things we have for granted and reminds us of how blessed we are.

I pray that this year all of us experience Lent as a meaningful, reflective time, and that as the days of Lent progress, we'll find ourselves drawing closer and closer to the heart of God.

May God bless you with a holy Lent.

### The Story of Lorraine Dove

Nellie McLaughlin, the St. Clement's archivist, had a conversation with St. Clement's parishioner Lorraine Santschi Dove several months before Lorraine's death in November at age 100. The article below is from that conversation and a paper about Lorraine written by Mary Richard.

At age 2 years and nine months Lorraine Santschi was invited by friends to join them in a visit to their daughter's dance class at the Ethel Morgan School of Dance in Chicago. Instead of just being part of the audience, Lorraine got up and joined the class. This was the beginning of what would become her lifetime career.

Later she was invited by Merriel Abbott to audition to become a student at the Merriel Abbott School of Dance in Chicago. At age 18 Lorraine was chosen by Ms. Abbott to attend dance classes at the Paris Opera Ballet School. As part of the Abbott International Dancers, Lorraine performed in London and Paris and for the future King Edward VIII.

Upon her return to Chicago, Lorraine performed with Josephine Buckley (later Josephine Flanders) and others in many places in Chicago, New York, San Francisco, and elsewhere. After a brief marriage, she had great fun dancing in "Love Thy Neighbor," a film with Fred Allen and Jack Benny. In 1950, after accepting an invitation from Jo Flanders to visit Honolulu, Lorraine decided to relocate to Hawaii, where she helped with choreography for the Christmas Pageant at Punahou School, taught classes at Punahou School, choreographed for the Junior League Christmas Ball, and found many dance and choreography opportunities. She became involved at Honolulu Community Theatre (now Diamond Head Theatre) and had many starring roles in their musicals. With "South Pacific" she toured military bases in the South Pacific, including Guam (where 5,000 military personnel viewed the performances!), the Philippines, Kwajalien, Eniwetok, Johnson Island, and Midway Island. After turning down an offer to test for the film "South Pacific," she married Harry Dove in 1957.

Lorraine became a founding Board Member of Hawaii Theatre for Youth in 1955, then its Production Manager, then Managing Director, and finally the volunteer Director for Development. She spent a year planning the first HTY tour. It included performances at the American Theatre Association convention in Chicago, at Kennedy Center in DC, and at New York's Lincoln Center's Outdoor Summer Festival. The tour put HTY "on the map" and allowed them to become a

professional theater with paid staff and cast. HTY then made her a life member of their Board.

Lorraine and Harry moved to the Big Island where Lorraine helped Richard Smart launch his Kahilu Theatre in Waimea, served as the chair of the Education Committee for the theater board, and was very involved with the hospital in Waimea.

Not having grown up in a church family, Lorraine had a feeling of not being complete which stayed with her until adulthood when she was invited to Holy Nativity Episcopal Church and was later baptized there. In her words, "I had that wonderful feeling of being where I belonged." She and Harry were married at St, Andrew's Cathedral and she came to St. Clement's in 2001, where she became a wonderful volunteer, a faithful participant, a good friend to many, and a treasured part of the St. Clement's ohana.

Lorraine said to Nellie, "Who do I tell myself I am? I am someone grateful for the experiences and even the challenges I've had...and for the opportunity to keep learning...and to contribute!" Rest in peace, Lorraine. You are missed.
