Reading Between the Lines: A Different Kind of Sunday School

When I first came to this small group Bible study, it was not what I expected. I wasn't asked to sit passively while an expert taught me what to think about Holy Scripture. Just the opposite. Class meetings were carefully structured but open-ended, and I found myself exposed to a wide diversity of viewpoints and perspectives. I was surprised but excited. As one of the guidelines for the class states, "The goal is not consensus, agreement or a right answer," but a deeper understanding of the biblical texts.

So what is Reading Between the Lines? It's a guided adult Bible study based on the church's lectionary. Each week we explore a different scripture passage from the New Testament or the Hebrew Bible. Depending on where we are in the church year, we will focus on a psalm of King David one week, then on one of Jesus's parables the next, and so on. Group members rotate facilitating the class, keeping us on track and on time as we navigate a series of questions designed to help us engage more deeply and more thoughtfully with the text.

How does an individual Reading Between the Lines class work? Initially, a set of questions guides us in understanding the content and meaning of the text itself. What exactly is being said and who is saying it? When and where are the words in the text spoken and under what circumstances?

The next set of questions asks us to apply the passage to today. Where do we see this scripture playing out in our neighborhoods, at our churches, our businesses, and in the world at large? Finally, a third set of questions asks us to apply the text to ourselves. How have we experienced these Biblical truths in our own lives? How might we apply them in the future?

The lesson also offers brief but pointed commentary by a variety of Biblical scholars. It concludes with a selection of additional short readings. These can be excerpts from poems, novels, plays, magazine articles, or songs. All are related to the scripture passage, and all encourage us to reflect on the text in a broader context.

When I was asked to write this article for the newsletter, I decided to survey my fellow class members to see what they valued about the RBTL experience. Everyone mentioned appreciating the diversity of participants, the wide range of opinions, and the willingness of people to listen to one another. As one participant put it, "Reading the Bible is not so much about being right but about working with others so that we all succeed in understanding the text."

Everyone feels that the class fosters an atmosphere of respect and acceptance, and while not everyone agrees with one another, there is always space for differing points of view. "We really listen to each other; we bounce ideas off one another." And the resulting discussions are "always thoughtful, even joyful."

Everyone agreed that the course guidelines helped. They ask us to "focus on the text," to "allow space for others to speak," and to keep what is said in the group confidential. One participant noted that he was initially "surprised at the diversity of perspectives," but has come to appreciate "a newfound empathy and insight." He describes the class as a "multifaceted gem" that offers "new ways of approaching and understanding scripture."

Another class member said that she found the range of responses fascinating. "We're not concerned about loss of face when we speak up with our questions and responses. The class is friendly and supportive even when our points of view diverge."

Other participants remarked that the class offered them the potential for spiritual growth. "Our real engagement with the scripture has helped me to better clarify my faith. And interacting with the biblical texts in discussion has encouraged me to integrate my faith into my life." Class members talked, too, about benefiting from relationships with others who want to explore Christ's message. "There is really no other time or place in my life when I sit down and share my spirituality with other Christians." This weekly engagement "nourishes, sustains, and uplifts me."

One class member likes that our weekly sessions give him the opportunity to see and consider scripture he has heard and read "time and time again," but in a new way. He noted that, as Episcopalians, we are encouraged to engage in intelligent discussion. "So, the atmosphere is positive, and it's okay to bring your own thoughts to bear on the text." This approach appeals to others as well. One participant calls himself "more skeptical" than the average Christian, but still open to becoming "convinced." For him, the course is a chance to not only learn more about the Bible but to also get a stronger handle on what it means to be a moral human being. He keeps coming every Sunday to "keep studying to be a better Christian."
